The call to action was unexpected. Surely it was too early for the Canadian invasion. But, no, said Devin; the geese are back. Not many, but surely time to start thinking how to fight back.

Devin directed me to the www.Goosinator.com website for inspiration. Clearly goose poop is a large and growing problem for parks, golf sources and other public use spaces.

growing problem for parks, golf courses and other public use spaces. Here is a picture of one commercially available RC solution. It is elegant in its simplicity but, with a price tag of \$3,000, would be a significant expense for the park in the current environment of cutbacks and rising operating costs. Another point I noticed is the exposed propeller. Not only is there a potential to injure a goose but also the risk of injuring a bystander or the operator in the event there is a loss of control.

Although Devin has obtained the necessary permits to shoot nuisance geese, it is much more desirable to try a non-lethal solution that makes the park unattractive as place to eat, rest and nest.



After searching through my assortment of odds, ends and crash remains I was able to come up with two matched ducted fan motors/ESC's, a couple of brushless motors that would also work and a pair of floats. On a trip to Trains & Lanes I told Greg what we were trying to do and he provided a Spectrum DX2E X'mitter and matched 2-channel Rx at a really awesome price. Greg said if there other items needed to complete the project he would give the club good pricing on those too. *Thank you Greg*

The idea of ducted fans is attractive because there are no exposed parts that present a strike hazard. On the flip side building a mechanical housing that can also swivel to provide directional control seems a bit more complicated than a prop and

The two styles were decided upon by the members present at an earlier meeting this Summer.


