Harvey was President for many years until about four years ago when because of health issues, he decided to retire as President." Harvey, so I have been told, has always had a keen interest in aviation, so much that his son is now very active in the field of aeronautics, and travels all over the world, even to Aberdeen, Scotland where he is presently working in the field.

Scott related this interesting anecdote about Harvey, "Back when we were putting on shows at the Carbon County Airport, and Gil still had his full scale Piper



Cherokee, he offered Harvey a quick flight. As you may or may not know, Harvey was interested in all things aviation so he wasn't going to pass up this chance, On rollout Gil was wondering, why isn't this plane climbing and only after leaving the ground did he think to ask Harvey how much he weighed. It was then that Gil figured out that between the two of them, the plane was overweight, and Gil had a cruising prop on the plane. They barely cleared the trees at the end of the runway. When they got back, Harvey said, he thought he might get to pick some apples on takeoff!"

Another story Scott related: "The one thing that I particularly remember when the club participated in the Tuscarora Aerorama Show. We had a member putting on a flight demonstration when Harvey, wearing his old straw hat and overalls, pretended to be drunk and wondered onto the flight line. He grabbed the transmitter out of the pilot's hands and started flying the plane all over the place. Someone finally came out with a pair of shears and cut the antenna off the radio. Harvey did such a good job that I heard several parents telling their kids to stay clear of him. Soon one of the park rangers - a young Irish lass- came up to Harvey and said, I'll have to be a-resting you now. We had to go and tell her it was just an act or Harvey would have been spending the afternoon somewhere else.

Rest in peace, Harvey. We will miss all that you did to help the club grow in members, activities and memories.
