Please make your way to Dotters Corner Road and Hell Hollow Road, Kunkletown, PA 18058. Actually this is a mailing address. His house is on the southwest corner and is closer to Kresgeville and Jonas than it is to Kunkletown.

If you are coming north from Lehighton, follow 209 north to the junction of route 534. Turn left at the light and follow route 534 to Barry S Road. There is a, lone two story house on the southwest corner. Turn left and continue until you reach Dotters Corner Road. Make a right then an immediate left on to Hell Hollow and a right into Bob's driveway. Park in the rear of the house.

From Jim Thorpe, you can take route 903 north to the junction with roue 534. Turn right and continue following 534 until you pass Jonas and arrive at Barry S Road on the right. There is a lone two story house on the southwest corner. Turn right and continue until you come to Dotters Corner Road. Turn right then left on to Hell Hollow Road and then right into Bob's driveway.

Those coming south from Brodheadsville or Stroudsburg follow route 209 south until you come to the junction of route 534. Turn right and continue to follow 534 until you arrive at Barry S Road on the left. There is a lone two story house on the southwest corner. Turn left and continue until you come to Dotters Corner Road. Turn right then left on to Hell Hollow Road and then right into Bob's driveway.
